Summary of FSU Curriculum Committee Action 2010-2011

Summary: Fifteen proposals were reviewed and passed for first and second readings (See table below for proposal details). There were minor changes made to the curriculum proposal form, and the most current form can be found in the forms repository on the Fairmont State website.

Other actions/comments:

1-27-2011 - The committee was informed of Dr. Rose's decision to change the process for prerequisite changes. Anyone changing prerequisites will submit the short form to Dr. Lavorata, and she will determine if the changes affect any other FSU or PC&TC program. If so, the change will need to be submitted to the Curriculum Committee as a proposal. Prerequisite changes will be considered throughout the year but will only be made effective with the following catalog. The intent is that the catalog accurately reflect prerequisites at any given time. Discussion ensued, and the committee requested that any prerequisite changes be distributed to the curriculum committee with the intent that all departments are made aware of the changes.

4-26-2011- A sub-committee was formed to review/revise the curriculum proposal form. The group desired to make the form more user friendly while preserving the overall content. The group used suggestions made by guests, committee members, and writers received throughout the academic year. A draft will be presented to the committee the first meeting in September 2011.
