This will reduce the hours required to complete the degree from 140 hours to 120 hours.

III. RATIONALE FOR THE PROPOSAL.

A. Quantitative Assessment: Indicate the types of assessment data, i.e., surveys, interviews, capstone courses, projects, licensure exams, nationally-normed tests, locally developed measurements, accreditation reports, etc., that were collected and analyzed to determine that curricular changes were warranted. An advisory committee made up of graduates over the past fifteen years was surveyed and their input was utilized to make the minor changes to the curriculum. All of the employers in the area are members of the RCB National Aerospace Education Center Technical Advisory Committee that meets twice a year and the school makes regular visits to the employer locations to discuss how graduates are progressing in their career field. The Federal Aviation Administration has nationally recognized tests, both written and practical exams, each student must to complete to receive their required ratings.

MGMT 4405 was eliminated due to changes in pre-requisites from the School of Business that required overrides to allow aviation students to enroll in this class. Some of this content is still being covered in existing AVMA classes. AVMA 2214 was deleted as the program no longer covers career planning to the level it once did. Again, some of this content is still being addressed in other classes such as AVMA 1102.
