This is the capstone course for journalism. In this course, students are required to perform on-the-job duties during a 100-our internship, gaining experience in a particular area of journalism, in accordance with the stated goals of the journalism programs. Assessment of student achievement of these goals will occur through both a submitted portfolio and the employer's report on the quality of the intern's work. Seniors only. Instructor approval required. Repeatable

We had interns placed last year with two supervisors who asked that the interns work through the academic year, rather than our providing a second intern. The supervisors wanted the "known quantity" rather than having to train a new intern. The placements were at the Marion County Convention and Visitors Bureau and the Office of Institutional Advancement.
