This proposal removes all AVIO and AVMT courses from the catalog. It also eliminates the first two years of the Aviation Maintenance Management program from being offered at FSU. Students being admitted to the program will now be required to have earned their FAA Airframe and Powerplant (A&P) license from another institution or through their military experiences. Such students will essentially be admitted with a minimum of 53 credit hours for their A&P license, perhaps about 60 with general studies courses or military credits. Students who enroll in our program should be able to complete their B.S. degree in the Aviation Maintenance Management program in about 2 years.

#### III. RATIONALE FOR THE PROPOSAL.

  - It has been at least a decade since FSU was responsible for the first two years of this program. With
    the separation of FSU and PCTC there have been many complications with sharing of space and
    student enrollment. FSU does not have the faculty or access to the facilities to teach these classes
    for the program. It will simplify matters to remove this source of conflict between the institutions.
    The College of Science and Technology is willing to sign articulation agreements with institutions to
    allow for seamless transfer of students into our program.

  - The B.S. degree will still be offered for those students who earn the FAA A&P license at another institution before enrolling at FSU. The Aviation Common Core is the basis for the Jr and Sr years of the program and these courses are already being offered for the Aviation Administration and Aviation Administration/Professional Flight degree programs. No additional expenses are expected.
