We propose making PYSC 3305, Research Methods, interchangeable with SOCY 3360, Methods of Social Research, for core requirement and prerequisite purposes. In addition, we propose that the course description in the course catalog be modified to reflect this change. Subsequently, this will increase the hours for this course from 3 to 4 increasing the total program hours by 1.
