Currently the program has three one-credit pharmacology courses which will be combined into one three-credit pharmacology course.

Currently the programs have three courses in maternal child. The revised curriculum separates maternal/infant and child and adolescents into separate courses. This will allow content in these courses to be streamlined from simple to complex.

NURS 1125 will move from an elective course to a required course.
